THE MAIN BARREL RACE WILL OFFER 10 INCENTIVE RACES

The Young Guns Incentive will award a saddle to a rider 8 years of age or younger with no additional entry fees. Fastest time wins in this straight time format.

Four winners in the Big Bucks Incentive will each have a chance to win one of the four \$5,000 checks during the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals, all for a \$20 entry fee. 4D format.

First Place winners in the Your Entry Fees Are Paid Incentive will each receive a \$500 gift certificate toward their entry fees into the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals. Entry fee into this 4D incentive is \$20.

The new WPRA Incentive is open ONLY to contestants who are also members of the Women's Pro Rodeo Association. With \$50 entry fees, \$500 added money, 100% payback, and straight time format, this will be an exciting incentive for many.

There will be three Rider Age Incentive Races – the Youth Incentive (ages 18 and under), the Adult Incentive (ages 18 – 49), and the Senior Incentive (ages 50 and above), each with \$1,000 added money, \$20 entry fees, 4D format, and 100% payback.

There will be two State Incentives based upon where the contestant resides – the Texas State Incentive and the All Other States Incentive. Each will have \$1,000 added money, \$20 entry fees, 4D format and 100% payback.

GENERAL EVENT INFORMATION

The *Resistol Ranch Boots Race for the Cash* will be held September 4 – 7, 2009 at the Heart O' Texas Coliseum in Waco, Texas.

This is a GUARANTEED barrel race. All money and prizes will be awarded regardless of the number of contestants participating. You do not have to be a member of WBR to run at this race, HOWEVER, in order for this event to fulfill the requirements to qualify for the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals, you must have completed membership requirements prior to the close of the event. The Main Barrel Race will be a 6D format with ½ second splits. There will also be a Warm-Up Barrel Race in a 4D format with ½, ½, full second splits. The Main Barrel Race will be run in sections of 400 entries each section. The current five sections are Friday Night, Saturday Day, Sunday Day, Sunday Night and Monday Day. The day sections will begin at 9:00 a.m. and the night sections at 6:00 p.m.

There will be one Warm-Up Barrel Race. The race will start at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday Night. It will be limited to 400 entries. You must enter a minimum of one horse in the Main Barrel Race to be eligible to enter the Warm-Up Barrel Race.

Entry fees for the Main Barrel Race are \$80 per horse. Entry fees for the Warm-Up Barrel Race will be \$60 per horse. A one-time processing fee of \$25 will be charged if you enter online, and \$30 if your entry is received by fax, mail, or at the event.

The Main Barrel Race will offer several Incentive Races, and Classic Equine will award \$500 to the highest placing contestant in each "D" whose horse is wearing Classic Equine splint and bell boots during the run.

The entry deadline for this event is August 12, 2009 without a late fee. NOTE: If you successfully enter online, you will know immediately if you are entered into the section you requested. When entering online, be sure to review and print your confirmation to make certain that you have entered correctly. Changes to online entries will need to be made ONLY on a Change Form for a fee of \$10. Mail and fax entries will be confirmed by return post.

DIVISION FORMATS

1. Main Race – 6D

The main barrel race will be run in a 6D format with .5 second splits.

- 1D = fastest time of the race
- 2D = fastest time of the race plus .5 second
- 3D = fastest time of the race plus 1.0 second
- 4D = fastest time of the race plus 1.5 seconds
- 5D = fastest time of the race plus 2.0 seconds
- 6D = fastest time of the race plus 2.5 seconds

If all placings in a Division are not filled, the remaining placings will be divided proportionally between the other divisions.

2. Warm-Up Race – 4D

The warm-up race will be run in a 4D format with .5, .5, 1 second splits.

- 1D = fastest time of the race
- 2D = fastest time of the race plus .5 second
- 3D = fastest time of the race plus 1 second
- 4D = fastest time of the race plus 2 seconds.

If all placing in a Division are not filled, the remaining placing will be divided proportionally between the other divisions.

3. Incentives – 4D

The Big Bucks, Your Entry Fees Are Paid, Rider Age, and State Incentives will be run in a 4D format with .5 second splits.

- 1D = fastest time of the race
- 2D = fastest time of the race plus .5 second
- 3D = fastest time of the race plus 1.0 second
- 4D = fastest time of the race plus 1.5 seconds

Rules and Frequently Asked Questions

BEFORE THE EVENT

1. How do I qualify for the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals?

ONLY WBRP MEMBERS will be allowed to compete in the Barrelnanza Finals. If you are not a current 2009 member, you MUST join WBRP and enter a minimum of one of our remaining races in order to compete at the Barrelnanza Finals. Competing in one race as a member will allow you to enter up to two horses at the Barrelnanza Finals. Competing as a member in two races will allow you to enter a maximum of five horses. Membership is \$60 per year for the first member and \$30 for each additional family member. If you entered a 2009 World Barrel Racing Productions event but forgot to purchase your membership at that event, you can pay an additional \$60 fee in order for that event to qualify you for the Barrelnanza Finals. Also keep in mind that if you purchase a Platinum Membership, one of the benefits is that you do not have to enter a 2009 event in order to qualify for the Barrelnanza Finals.

2. How do I enter the Resistol Ranch Boots Race for the Cash?

The first to enter will receive their choice of sections in which to run. Meeting the "Post Mark Deadline" does not guarantee you a position in a section, so enter early. Late entries will receive their choice of sections ONLY if space is available in the requested section. All late entries faxed or submitted online August 13th – September 3rd, 2009 will be assessed a \$20 late fee and must be paid for in advance by credit card. Entries that are entered On-Site will be charged \$30 late fee and must be done 2 hours prior to the section starting. Late entries will only be accepted by fax to 432-224-1222. The late entry deadline by fax is Thursday, September 3rd at 4pm. Do not mail entries in after the "Post Mark Deadline." Please, no changes to your entry after you send them in. If so there will be an additional change fee.

There are four ways to enter:

- a. Online at www.worldbarrelracing.com. Our easy-to-complete online entry will be available until Friday, August 12th, 2009 without a late fee. A \$20 late fee is assessed after August 12th. There is a \$25 processing fee when entering online. The last day to enter online is August 21st.
- b. By fax to 432-224-1222. Contestants pay a one-time processing fee of \$30 to enter by fax and may do so without penalty through 4:00 pm, Wednesday, August 12th, 2009. Contestants wishing to late enter may do so until 4 pm, Thursday, September 3rd, 2009. All late entries will be assessed a \$20 late fee in addition to the processing fee.
- c. By mail to: WBRP, P.O. Box 1330, Athens, TX 75751. Contestants pay a one-time processing fee of \$30 to enter by mail. All entries must be postmarked by Wednesday, August 12th.
- d. On-Site entry: All onsite entries must be completed two hours prior to the section in which you wish to enter begins. All on-site entries must pay a \$30 late fee and the processing fee. They are also based on availability of that section.

3. How do I enter the Warm-Up Race?

In order to enter the Warm-Up race you must enter at least one horse in the Main Barrel Race. You can enter up to a maximum of 5 horses. There will be one Warm-Up Barrel Race. The race will start at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday Night. The warm-up race will be limited to 400 entries. The Warm-Up race will have a

guaranteed payout of \$10,000 cash and 3 custom Martin Saddles. Note: The Warm-Up Race will be run on the same pattern as the Main Race.

4. **If I buy a membership, enter a race and can't attend that race, will I still qualify for the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals?**

Extenuating circumstances (such as the high cost of fuel) may make the decision to attend a regular season event difficult for some contestants, thus keeping them from being able to qualify for the Finals. Last year, several individuals realized that they could qualify for the Finals if they entered an event and were turned out. Although we would prefer that you experience a WBRP event in person prior to the Finals, we have no control over this. Our staff must assume that individuals who are turned out were actually present, but missed their run. This does not apply to individuals who choose to draw out of an event. Please understand that if you draw out and are refunded any portion of your entry fees, you will not be counted as having attended the event.

5. **Late Entries (L.E.)**

All Late Entries received after August 24th, 2009 at 4 pm will be placed at the bottom of the draw. The Late Entry draw will not be posted until 1 hour prior to the beginning of each section. The Late Entry draw will be a random computer draw.

6. **What are the procedures for drawing out of the barrel race?**

A draw out refund for entry fees, stall fees, and RV fees, less a 25% service charge, will be granted to qualifying contestants for any reason. Sorry no refunds for processing fees. The "Draw out Form" must be completed and returned to the show secretary by 4:00pm, Monday, August 24th. Keep in mind that vet releases, doctor releases, or any other form of paperwork is NOT required to draw out. People have taken advantage of vet releases in the past, that is why there is a draw-out deadline. Therefore, after the deadline has passed, no refunds will be given for any reason. DON'T ASK! A Draw-Out Form can be found on our webpage or one can be faxed to you. **NOTE:** Your draw out is not official until you receive a fax confirmation page from us, so please list a return fax number.

7. **Are horse substitutions allowed?**

Yes you can substitute a horse in this barrel race, however if the horse is already entered you cannot place him into another draw position. Any horse substitution must be made with the show secretary, in writing, at least 2 hours before your section begins or if running on Monday, September 7th, by 10:00am. The horse substitution must be made before you run. Each contestant will receive one free horse change per year after that time you must pay \$10. All horse changes must be submitted on a change form.

8. **Are rider substitutions allowed?**

If you enter and wish to change riders under emergency circumstances you may do so until Friday, August 21st, with a \$10 fee. After this date you are allowed to change riders for (\$25) until 24 hours prior to the beginning of the first section. Keep in mind once the original rider has been changed they may not participate on any other horse during the event.

9. **Can I change Sections?**

If you enter and wish to change sections, you may do so up until Friday, August 21st, with a \$10 fee. After this date you are allowed one section change per year (\$25) under emergency circumstances until 24 hours prior to the beginning of the first section.

10. Can I sell my run?

No, you cannot sell a run. If you are unable to participate in the Resistol Ranch Boots Race for the Cash your only option is to draw out completely on or before Monday, August 24th. No one can purchase your run. New entries will be accepted if availability exists.

11. Incentive Races

a. What are the "Incentive Races?"

World Barrel Racing Productions has 10 incentive races. You only make one run and that run/time counts for the "Main Barrel Race" as well as any "Incentives" that you have entered. When applicable, entry fees into the incentives are \$20. If you enter any incentive after the Post Mark Deadline the entry fees for the Incentives are \$25 each, unless you are paying a late fee. Please note: Entry into all Incentives is purely optional.

b. Do I have to enter the "Incentive Races" when I send in my entry form, or can I enter at the event?

It is best to enter the Incentive Races when you send in your entry form; however you can enter onsite at the Resistol Ranch Boots Race for the Cash at least 2 hours before you run, or if running on Monday by 10:00am. There will be a \$5.00 late fee for each incentive.

c. With so many "Incentive Races", how do I know what to enter?

i. "Young Guns Incentive"

This incentive is open to everyone entered in the main barrel race who is 8 years of age or under as of January 1, 2009 (born on or after January 2, 2000).

Fee: There is NO entry fee for this incentive race, however, it is the contestant's responsibility to enter this incentive when they enter the Main Barrel Race. Contestants may **NOT** win more than one saddle per year prior to the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals. At the Finals qualifying contestants may enter this incentive, but keep in mind that the qualifications will be the same. You must enter in at least one event as a member in order to qualify for the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals.

Format: This race is not in a divisional format. Fastest time wins.

Prize: The contestant with the fastest time will receive a Martin Youth Saddle

ii. "Big Bucks Incentive"

Winners in this incentive will qualify to race in the Big Bucks Race during the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals. Winners of each Division in the Finals race will receive \$5,000 each – GUARANTEED making a total of \$20,000 to be given away to a limited number of contestants. This incentive is open to everyone entered in the main barrel race.

Fee: \$20 entry fee/per horse

Format: 4D format with ½ second splits.

Prizes: The first place winners of each "D" in this race will each receive a voucher that qualifies them to participate in the Big Bucks Race during the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals. Winners in the "Big Bucks" Incentive at a regular season event do NOT receive cash

prizes. Please remember as a winner of a voucher that you have the right to sell or give your voucher away to anyone who is qualified and running in the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals, but remember no vouchers will be reissued if lost or stolen. **Note: If there is a tie for first place each contestant (that is tied for first place) will receive a certificate.**

iii. **“Your Entry Fees Are Paid”**

This incentive is open to everyone entered in the main barrel race.

Fee: \$20 entry fee/per horse

Format: 4D format with ½ second splits.

Prizes: The first place winner in the 1D, 2D, 3D, and 4D will receive a voucher in the amount of \$500 to be used to assist them with entry costs to attend the 2009 Barrelnanza Finals. This voucher may be used for entry fees, stall fees, RV fees, etc. (Sorry not on shavings.)

No money will be refunded should there be a remaining value after applying the voucher towards the rider’s entry. The voucher does not have a cash value. Please remember that as a winner of a coupon that you have the right to sell or give your coupon away but, no vouchers will be reissued if lost or stolen.

iv. **“WPRA Incentive”**

The “WPRA Incentive” race is a race with in the Main Barrel Race. You only make one run and that run counts towards the “Main Barrel Race” and the “WPRA Incentive.” The contestant must be a current member of the WPRA when they run. This incentive is open to everyone entered in the main barrel race who is a current member of the WPRA.

Added Money: \$500 will be added

Fee: \$50 entry per horse

Payback: 100% payback

v. **“Rider Age Incentive”**

The “Rider Age Incentive” race is a race within the “Main Barrel Race.” You only make one run and that run counts toward the “Main Barrel Race” and the “Rider Age Incentive”. This incentive is open to everyone entered in the main barrel race. Rider Age Incentives are determined by the age of the rider as of September 4, 2009 and will be based on the following age chart:

Youth: 18 years of age or less (born on or after September 5, 1990)

Adult: 19-49 years of age (born between September 5, 1959 and September 4, 1990)

Senior: 50 years of age or older (born on or before September 4, 1959)

Added Money: \$1,000 will be added to each "Rider Age Incentive"

Fee: \$20 entry fee per horse

Format: 4D format with ½ second splits

Payback: 100% payback

vi. **"State Incentives"**

The "State Incentive" race is a race within the "Main Barrel Race." You only make one run and that run counts toward the "Main Barrel Race" and the "State Incentive". **PLEASE NOTE:** Proof of residency will be required for all winners. We will be checking government or state issued IDs and you must enter the incentive for the state that matches the address on your ID. This incentive is open to everyone entered in the main barrel race. State Incentives are determined by where the rider lives and will be based on the following chart:

Texas: Residents of Texas

Other: Residents of all other states

Added Money: \$1,000 will be added to each of the two state incentives

Fee: \$20 entry fee per horse

Format: 4D format with ½ second splits

Payback: 100% payback

vii. **“Classic Equine Bonus Bucks”**

As part of the “Classic Equine Bonus Program”, Classic Equine has agreed to award a \$500 bonus to the winners of each “D”, if the horse is wearing Classic Equine splint and bell boots. If not, the bonus will go to the next contestant meeting those requirements. To verify the horse is wearing Classic Equine splint (polo wraps do not qualify) and bell boots, we will look at photos or video taken by our official photographer at the event.

In some cases, the logo on the boots does not show up in the photo, it is suggested that you take a picture with your camera, or camera phone for additional verification. A backdrop will be provided and all personal photos must be taken at this backdrop. **Note: You are automatically entered into this incentive.**

12. **What are the “Specialty Races?”**

a. **“How hard can it be race”**

How many times have you heard your husband, father, or significant other say, “**HOW HARD CAN IT BE** to run around 3 barrels?” Well, this September in Waco we’re going to give them another opportunity to find out!

The rules will be simple – all standard barrel racing rules will apply, PLUS the husband, father, or significant other must NOT have competed in a barrel race, including a previous How hard Can It Be Race, during the past year and must ride a horse that their loved one has entered in the Main Barrel Race. Entry fee is \$20 and contestants may only enter on one horse. This race will be limited to the first twenty contestants entered.

Prizes are: 1st – Belt Buckle and \$200 entry fee credit to WBRP barrel races; 2nd – Jacket and \$100 entry fee credit to WBRP barrel races.

AT THE EVENT

13. **Check-In**

Upon your arrival at the Resistol Ranch Boots Race for the Cash we ask that you please take care of checking in to any stalls or RVs at the Stall Office. You do not have to check in with the entry office, just make sure you take a look at the posting boards to know your run number. You will need to check in with the gateman 5 runners prior to your run.

14. How will the stalls & RVs be handled?

As with all WBRP events, you may check into your reserved stalls and/or RV spaces after 2:00 p.m. on the date reserved. You MUST check out of the stalls and/or RV spaces by noon the following day. If your slide out or awning take up two spaces you will be charged for two spaces or if none are available you will be asked to put them up.

There are 600± stalls at the Heart O' Texas Fair Complex that will be available at \$20 per night. Two bags of shavings are required and must be purchased from the arena at fair market value. No outside shavings are allowed. No portable panels or tying horses to the trailers overnight, if stalls are available.

NOTE: ALL STALLS WILL BE PRE-ASSIGNED. If you are traveling to the event in a group and would like for the horses in your group to be stalled near each other, we ask that ONE of the contestants in your group reserve ALL needed stalls. This will make the check-in/check-out process go a bit more smoothly for all concerned. (No buddy forms will be accepted at this event so be sure one person reserves all the stalls in the group.)

Additionally, the facility offers 200 RV hookups at \$25 per night.

15. Will there be Exhibitions at the this event?

No, there will not be Exhibitions.

16. Will there be an Open Arena at this event?

Open Arena will be on Friday from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm unless we have to open the Friday Day section.

17. Opening Ceremonies

You'll want to make sure to attend the opening ceremonies, held 15 minutes prior to the beginning of each section. In addition to music and dancing, there will be a number of games played that involve the audience.

Frisbees will be thrown out with prizes such as saddle pads, bronc halters, stirrups, and t-shirts. One Frisbee will be identified as the Oxy-Gen Money Throw Frisbee. After the first big drag, the person with this special Frisbee will have a chance to throw their Frisbee into an Oxy-Gen bucket located on the first barrel. If they are successful during the Resistol Ranch Boots Race for the Cash, they will receive \$5,000 cash!

18. Games

Be sure to bring the entire family to the Resistol Ranch Boots Race for the Cash! During the big drags, we'll involve our audience with a variety of fun-filled games. The Egg-Toss, Ladies 40 & Over Dance contest, and Dizzy Stick Horse are just a few of the games that will be held. All games are open to the public and free to enter.

19. Contests

Frisbees will be thrown out with prizes such as saddle pads, bronc halters, stirrups, and t-shirts. One Frisbee will be identified as the Oxy-Gen Money Throw Frisbee. After the first big drag, the person with this special Frisbee will have a chance to throw their Frisbee into an Oxy-Gen bucket located on the first barrel. If they are successful during the Resistol Ranch Boots Race for the Cash, they will receive \$5,000 cash!

20. Dress Code

All contestants must wear a long-sleeved shirt, long pants, Western Hat (minimum 2 1/2" brim), and cowboy boots or equestrian sport shoes. Caps are not permitted. Hats must stay on until contestant breaks the plane of the arena. **NOTE:** If the hat falls off and lands in the alleyway or arena, a \$10 dress code fine will be assessed. Helmets are not required but all contestants are encouraged to wear one. Anyone not wearing the proper attire in the arena will be assessed a \$10 fine. The fine money will be going to the American Cancer Society for Breast Cancer Research.

21. Sportsmanship

All contestants and their family members are expected to display good sportsmanship at all times. No level of abuse toward any animal at this event will be allowed. Foul language, misconduct or abusive comments spoken to any Contestant, Spectator, Staff Member, or Arena Personnel will result in immediate contestant disqualification and no refund of entry fees. Contestants are also responsible for traveling companions and their family members.

22. Will there be Photos and a Video of my run?

To ensure that no horse is ridden by more than one person (with the exception of contestants who meet conditions detailed in the Family Rules), WBRP photographs and videotapes each contestants' individual run. These photos/videos are the property of WBRP and decisions made by WBRP management as a result of photo and/or video review are final.

23. Why are fines and late fees assessed?

There are fines and late charges at all barrel races because a few people will not follow the rules. The fines or late charges are used to persuade them. The management of WBRP does not like the fines or late charge but has found out that they must have them. One half of all fines and late charges will be donated to the American Cancer Society for Breast Cancer Research.

24. How can the condition of the ground be consistent with so many racers competing over such a long time period?

An important element of any barrel race is the condition of the dirt in the arena. World Barrel Racing Productions recognizes this concern and has retained D & G Dirt Crew to handle this important detail at the Resistol Ranch Boots Race for the Cash. Every 5 racers, three tractors quickly drag the arena floor. A "big" drag occurs after every 50 riders. Also, after each section we will re-prepare the ground. All this is done to ensure that the playing field truly is "even." The D & G Dirt Crew is considered to be the best in the world.

25. Must be ready

Contestant shall identify themselves to the Gate Man and be in the holding area five before their run. The Gate Man to be located next to the alley way going into the arena. Failure to do so will result in a disqualification. Contestant's name will be called by the Gate Man three times, if the contestant is not in the arena by the third call they will be disqualified. Only one horse may be in the alleyway at any time. Remember the three official calls come from the Gate Man not the Announcer.

26. Time Limit

If a contestant is in the holding pen and attempts to enter the arena, but is unable to get the horse down the alleyway the gateman, after the second call, will give the rider 60 seconds to enter the arena. At the end of 60 seconds if the horse has not broken the plane at the end of the alleyway into the area the rider

will be disqualified. (The reason for this rule is the safety of the contestant, the other contestants in the holding area and the employees.)

27. Time Begins

Any time a contestant crosses the starting line, the time will begin.

28. Fastest Run Possible

Contestants must attempt to make the fastest run possible. Any obvious attempt to "pull up" or pace their run may result in the following penalties-1st Offense-Warning, 2nd Offense-\$50 fine, 3rd Offense-one year on the "ineligible" list of the WBRP.

29. No Time

A "No Time" will be given to the contestant for the following reasons:

- a. If the contestant "circles" their horse after entering or exiting the arena. (Definition of the Arena is past the plane of the alley)
- b. If the contestant misses the barrel pattern.
- c. If the contestant runs out of turn. It is the contestant's responsibility to know their draw position.
- d. If a contestant knocks over a barrel. A "no time" will also be given if a barrel is knocked over and it sets up again on either end. Touching a barrel, including to keep it from falling, is permitted without penalty.
- e. If the contestant's horse falls during the run in such a manner as to break the pattern, or if the rider falls off of the horse.
- f. Unable to get horse in arena in 60 second time limit.

30. Training in Arena

Contestants who are given a "no time", either for missing the pattern or knocking down a barrel, may complete the pattern. However, show management may, at its discretion, ask a rider who is taking excessive time to train to leave the arena immediately. If such request is not complied with, a \$25 fine may be assessed.

31. Horses in Arena

Only one horse may be in the arena, or alleyway, at any time during competition. (The reason for this rule is the safety of the contestant. Accidents can occur where the assisting horse gets in front of the contestant horse and the contestant horse then decides to go and runs into the assisting horse.)

32. Re-Runs

Re-runs shall be granted if the official and backup timer both fail to work properly, unless a barrel has been turned over resulting in a no-time. If the barrels are not placed properly on their markers, a re-run shall also be granted without any penalties being applied; however, any penalty occurring on the re-run shall result in a no-time.

33. Barrel Moved

If a barrel moved off its marker during competition, the barrel must be reset prior to the next competitor's run.

34. Family Rule

Contestants may ride any horse, regardless of ownership, and may ride up to 5 horses. However, a horse may not be shown by more than one person in the barrel race, unless the following conditions are met:

- a. Both contestants are members of the same immediate family who reside in the same household (husband, wife, children and grandchildren 21 and under).
- b. Children and grandchildren 21 and under who are attending school away from home, but who reside part of the year with their parents or grandparents are included under this rule.
- c. Neither contestant is showing any other horse in that barrel race.
- d. In no case will the same horse be run more than twice in the same barrel race.

35. Disqualifications

Any act deemed prejudicial to the best interests of WBRP may result in the disqualification of the contestant with no refund of entry fees. The contestant may also be placed upon the "ineligible" list of WBRP. These acts may include but are not limited to the following:

- a. Using abusive or intemperate language or attempting to threaten, bribe, influence, or harass any contestant, spectator, staff member, or Arena Personnel. Also, any remarks made with the intent to cast aspersions on the character or integrity of a WBRP staff member or management member.
- b. Moving or attempting to move markers at any time.
- c. Use of electronic and/or remotely controlled devices to alter the outcome of a run.
- d. Abuse of a horse in anyway.
- e. Competing while under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- f. Misidentifying a horse in any WBRP Barrel Race class.
- g. Misidentifying a rider in any WBRP Barrel Race class.
- h. Other conduct that is not in the best interest of the WBRP, or its contestants.
- i. Failure to make good on a returned check to WBRP or to any other association which has a cooperative agreement with WBRP on returned checks.
- j. WBRP Management, at their sole discretion, shall have the authority to disqualify or deny entry to any horse they deem dangerous to the rider or to other individuals, animals or property.

36. Safety

Safety is a prime objective at this barrel race. If you have a horse that could be dangerous to yourself, other contestants, or other horses, DO NOT come to this barrel race. Any horse or contestant deemed to be dangerous by the management of WBRP will be disqualified and entry fees will not be refunded.

37. Rules

The management of WBRP reserves the right to create any new rule, or modify any existing rule, in order to better the sport or this barrel race.

AFTER THE DUST SETTLES

38. How will the \$20,000 Grand Prize be awarded?

After the conclusion of the event on Sunday afternoon, we will ask everyone that placed in the top 15 of each Division to come to the grandstands in the main arena. A random "chip" will be drawn from one box containing six "chips" numbered 1-6, representing each Division. This randomly drawn "chip" will indicate in which Division the Grand Prize winner placed. A second random "chip" will then be drawn from a second box containing fifteen "chips" numbered 1-15. This randomly drawn "chip" will indicate the position in which the Grand Prize winner placed.

Example: The first "chip" drawn is a 4 and the second "chip" drawn is a 12. This means that the person placing 12th in the 4D wins the \$20,000 Grand Prize.

You do not have to be present to win the Grand Prize. However, all prize claim rules shall apply to the Grand Prize, such as prize release form and winner's form requirements.

39. How will the saddles be awarded?

After the event on Sunday afternoon we will have a saddle presentation. In cases of a tie, we will roll the dice to determine the winner. High roll wins the Saddle. Saddles will be picked in order by placing of the D's of the contestants that are there or have a representative there. All other saddles will be shipped when the staff returns to the office

40. If I run on Friday and you do not pay out until Sunday night, do I have to be present to receive my money and prize?

You do NOT have to be present to win a Saddle or Buckle. You can fill out a "Prize Release Form" and a friend can choose your prize and pickup your check. If you win anything other than a Saddle or Buckle and you (or your friend) can not pick it up at the event, your check and a "Your Choice of Prize" will be mailed to you. You must have a current 2009 membership or a Winners form for this event filled out in order to receive your check and prize. To choose your prize you will need to go to www.worldbarrelracing.com click on the forms link and then pick Choose Your Prize. Be sure to complete the form in its entirety. All winners' forms and prizes must be picked 90 days from the event or they will be forfeited.

All Incentive checks will be mailed out on Tuesday after the event, If the contestant has all the appropriate paperwork completed.

Notice due to the rise in shipping cost and shipping supplies all prizes that are shipped will cost the contestant a \$10 shipping fee Saddles will cost \$35. So our suggestion is to get a friend to pick up your prize and check. They will need all the necessary paperwork.

41. Tie for Prizes

If any contestant's times are tied, the prize money will be split equally and a roll of the dice between the tied contestants will determine the tie for the awards. High roll wins.

42. Payout Requirements

In order to receive your money, a winner's form or a completed membership application (including a drivers license/birth certificate, and social security number) is required within 90 days of the event or all monies will be forfeited.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AND LINKS

43. What are the arena and facilities like?

The Heart O' Texas Coliseum is located at 4601 Bosque Blvd, Waco, Texas 76710.

The HOT Fair Complex was constructed after voters of the county had authorized a bond issue of \$1,200,000 in the early 1950s. Despite public criticism that might be directed toward the board and individual members, it was the board's unanimous decision to build portions of the entire plant that the available money would permit. The last of five contracts was signed on January 9, 1952, and construction of the Coliseum began soon afterward. The Coliseum, livestock barn, ticket booths and several small buildings were constructed, paving was done and fencing enclosed the grounds. In the spring of 1953, the Coliseum was completed, and on April 11th, the formal opening was held.

All facilities and grounds of the Fair Complex underwent renovations and/or reconstruction throughout the years of 2000 to 2005. The Complex now covers 50 acres of land containing modernized facilities, 700 stalls, and 250 RV hook-ups and parking areas able to accommodate over 3800 vehicles. Its facilities consist of the Heart O' Texas Coliseum, Back Porch Club, Dodge Show Pavilion, General Exhibits Building, Creative Arts Building and the recently constructed Stall Barn.

The Heart O' Texas Coliseum has one of the largest indoor arenas in the state of Texas. The recently renovated, air conditioned, multi-purpose facility contains a rodeo seating capacity of over 6,000 with a 310' x 125' arena floor. As many as 9,000 can be accommodated when seats are placed in the arena for non-rodeo events. Along with its many features and other amenities, the Coliseum has ample restrooms, four concession areas and dressing rooms. This magnificent building makes possible great fair and other events for this region.

The Heart O' Texas Show Pavilion opened in early 2002, which includes an indoor air-conditioned 125' x 250' arena, a warm up arena and an attached 125' x 280' covered arena. The Show Pavilion contains over 450 horse stalls, those not including the recently constructed Stall Barn containing 260 stalls. Its many other amenities include 25 pens, modernized restrooms and dressing rooms containing showers, 10 wash stalls, meeting rooms and concession and novelty areas. The Heart O' Texas Fair Complex is no doubt the center of activity among livestock and horse shows throughout the Southwest.

47. Returned Checks

There is a \$40 service charge on all returned checks from the bank, for any reason. If a check is not replaced with a cashier's check or money order within 30 days after the check is dated, the contestant will be put on the "ineligible" list.

48. Dogs

Dogs must be on a leash at all times.

49. Vendors

There shall be no selling of any type of merchandise or professional service on the arena grounds, in stalls, or at trailers without a vendor contract with WBRP.
